

We anticipated all the fish we would catch that night. As we talked at work in the days leading up to the trip the imagination and size of the fish grew. We had hopes of catching record size fish-42" stripers.

It wasn't to be. We had a great time. Mostly caught scup, a black bass and an almost fluke.



Nick who bought and fixed-up the place did an absolutely amazing job. He restored both the exterior and interior mostly on his own back. Every inch was clean and thoughtfully restored.

# EQUIPMENT FOR LIGHTHOUSE AND GROUNDS

Much needed equipment was purchased or donated for the upkeep of the grounds and lighthouse buildings: Two new weed trimmers, a hand saw, a used lawn mower (donated by Dave Kelleher), used shovels, hoe, rake and pitch fork (donated by Judy Kelly).

#### LIGHTHOUSE PROGRAMS

Dave's Lighthouse Programs were presented at a number of events and schools this year including:

Emerald Bay Manor on April 8, Rhode Island Saltwater Anglers Association on April 28, National Teachers Association on May 6, Young Adult Club at St. Brendan's on September 9 and AARP of East Providence on September 4. School programs included three 4th grades at Alice M. Waddington School on June 18 and four 4th grades as part of a full day program about Rhode Island at Richmond School on May 23.

# WINDOW PROJECT COMPLETED

Glad to report that all the windows in the lighthouse are now in good shape following a project started last fall.

The Lizzotte Glass Company refurbished all the 1871 windows. Joe Estrella, Nate Chace, Andy Valerio and others reinstalled the windows, putting in new ropes, painting parts of the casings and even polishing the solid brass pulleys.

Two workers of the Lizzotte Company, Brendan and Cory, replaced one of the large 1871 glass panels in the lantern room.

The original 1871 glass panel is being saved with the possibility that it can be fashioned into some kind of keepsakes.

#### SAVE THE BAY TOURS

Save The Bay increased the number of tours this year to include two half-day tours from Providence and two from Newport.

The two half-day tours from Providence included, for the first time, a stop at Pomham Rocks. It was a great feeling showing the lighthouse (just the first floor) and grounds to the public. It is just the beginning of our plans to open up the island to many more visitors next year.

Most of the tours were sold out. It is apparent that these tours are becoming more popular with people across the country.

#### FLOATING DOCK

Joe Estrella has continued his work on getting a new 8 foot floating dock to extend out from the floating dock now in place at the lighthouse. It takes much time and effort on his part to obtain all the permits and necessary paperwork to allow us to put the dock in place. In the mean time Joe ordered all the material to build the dock ourselves and had it delivered to his house. As of July 28th, everything was approved.

Joe, Andy Valerio and Joe's son, Jeff, have proceeded to build the dock in his driveway. Once built, it was then brought to the Sabin Point boat ramp and floated over to the lighthouse and installed.

A&M Marine put in two pilings a few days later at the far end of the new dock. This new dock will be most helpful in docking our new ferry, the Lady Pomham, as we begin plans on more public visits to the island next year.

## THE LADY POMHAM

Purchasing the launch last fall from the Bristol Yacht Club was just the beginning of a long process of preparing the boat for launching, including painting the hull. Once in the water Joe and Mike motored the boat to the East Providence Yacht Club. Once there, Joe had to replace a number of safety articles on the boat and also had to take care of a number of certificates and tests to allow him to operate the boat. These included, a drug test, a certificate to operate the radio, the registration of the radio, and the preparation of Lady Pomham for the official inspection by the United States Coast Guard. The inspection was very specific in detail and included an overboard rescue exercise with Oscar, the dummy model, which was very difficult, but Joe successfully passed. All and all it has taken a couple of months for Joe to accomplish all the necessary details.

The Lady Pomham is now officially a ferry; and with Joe's captain's license, she is able to carry 12 people. Thanks, Joe, for all you have done to get the Lady Pomham approved.

# **RHODE ISLAND LIGHTHOUSES**

David Kelleher will present a program about all 21 Rhode Island Lighthouses at the Fall Speakers' Meeting.
