SUMMER WRAP UP

Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse had another busy season. This newsletter includes reports of the activities.

EXTERIOR PAINTING/FOUNDATION

Andy Leddy (a member of our group) and his Company were contracted to paint the exterior of the lighthouse and address the condition of the foundation.

The total first level of the lighthouse was repainted. A number of areas where some rotting had occurred, mainly in the Northeast corner of the house, were restored.

The foundation was completely pointed to bring it back to its original condition and a fabricated storm door, a style of the 1950's, was installed on the south side of the house.

The second level and the tower were in good condition and did not need repainting at this time.

Thank you, Andy and Company for a job well done.

WORK PARTIES

Dave Kelleher and Joe Estrella organized a monthly work party at the lighthouse during August, September and October. The fence gate surrounding the solar panels was painted and a new coat of paint was given the areas that needed it. The cellar was cleaned out of its old oil tank, certain pipes from the heating system removed, a plywood platform installed for the new electrical system, and the area cleaned for a space to keep all our yard tools. The grass was cut and trimmed, windows on the second floor had the paint touched up, fire extinguishers were replaced and some framing around the downstairs bathroom installed. Fake coyotes were placed on the lawn to help keep Canada geese off the grounds.

RHODE ISLAND LIGHTHOUSE PROGRAM



David Kelleher continues to present our program about Rhode Island Lighthouses to a number of school children. This year he went to the three fourth grade classes at Waddington School in Riverside and the four fourth grade classes at the Richmond School in Richmond. He has been going to these two schools for the last four years and has established a good relationship with the staffs in these two buildings.

Dave also presented the lighthouse program to the residents of Evergreen Nursing Home and the history of Pomham Rocks to members of the Masonic Lodge in East Providence.

LOCAL HISTORIC COMMISSION VISITS LIGHTHOUSE

Members of the Local Historic Commission made a visit to the lighthouse. They were invited by Dave Kelleher who is a member of the commission. The commission is responsible to oversee all the local historic properties in East Providence and to help and make sure that these properties are well taken care of.

The members were very pleased to see the progress that the Friends have done over the last 11 years. Dave gave them a full tour of the grounds and the exterior and interior of the lighthouse and oil house.

PROVIDENCE RIVER BOAT COMPANY

We began a new relationship with the Providence River Boat Company, a company which has been providing tours around the upper bay and the Providence River, including WaterFire, for years.

Kristen Stone contacted David in the early spring to see if we were interested in arranging some visits to the island this summer. Her plans were to make two trips to the island on three different days. The first trip would be at 9:00 and include a small breakfast; the second trip at 12:00 would include a picnic lunch.

The trips were sold out so quickly that a third trip was added for the next two dates and a fourth date was also added on later in the season.

This is just a beginning of more possible trips to the island next year.



SAVE THE BAY TOURS

Dave continued to work with Save The Bay Lighthouse Tours. This was the fifth year of our relationship with Save The Bay. The tours were divided into three categories: Northern, the lights in the upper bay. Southern, the lights in the lower bay around Newport and Jamestown and Ultimate includes all the lights in the The northern tours included visiting Pomham Rocks. Stopping at Pomham will make the Northern tours more popular and Save The Bay is greatly interested in increasing these visits next season. These tours have benefitted our restoration efforts by informing hundreds of passengers from around the state and country about Pomham Rocks, and donating close to \$1,000 to us.
