GRANT AWARDED

On January 11, at the Odeum Theater in East Greenwich, the Rhode Island Historical Preservation and Heritage Commission announced the State Preservation grant recipients. One of the recipients was the Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse, a chapter of the American Lighthouse Foundation. The grant was a \$150,000 matching grant. The lighthouse group will now need to raise \$150,000 new funds in order to comply with the matching grant. The award was presented by Mr. Edward Sanderson, Executive Director of the Rhode Island Preservation and Heritage Commission to Mr. Nathan Chace, Director of Development for the Friends. This award is greatly appreciated by the Friends and will be used to continue the restoration of the lighthouse and grounds.

The Friends have been working on the restoration of the lighthouse since 2004, and have successfully restored the exterior of the building, improved the docking facilities and fencing and obtained a new boat for transportation to and from the island.

With this grant, the Friends will now be able to go forward with the installation of a cable to the island to bring electricity to the lighthouse. Once this is accomplished, a heating system will be installed then leading to the restoration of the interior. Much work needs to be done and this grant will greatly help the goals of the Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse.

FRIENDS RECEIVES COUNCIL CITATION

On Tuesday, March 1, the East Providence City Council presented a citation to the Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse on their receiving a \$150,000 matching grant from the State Historic Preservation and Heritage Commission. Our group is now working on raising the matching \$150,000.

Councilman Timothy Conley presented the citation to David Kelleher who represented the FPRL at the meeting. David thanked the Council and discussed the restoration done so far and the plans for the future in working on getting electricity to the island and restoring the interior. David was pleased with the reception from the audience and the Council members.

ANNUAL MEETING

The Friends came together for our annual meeting at Madeira Restaurant. In addition to a delicious meal the evening included our business meeting and annual election. Treasurer Mike Tripp presented a summation of our financial activity for the year, which included a report on our extra 'Tours and Presentations' income resulting from Dave Kelleher securing donations to the Friends as a result of tours he narrated for both Save the Bay and Providence River Boat Company. He concluded by informing us that we are prepared to pay for the upcoming power restoration.

Nate Chace gave an update on fund-raising efforts for the organization which included the acknowledgement of a \$5000 grant from New England Lighthouse Lovers (NELL) and an anonymous donation of \$50,000. He informed the attendees about the possibility of our receiving a \$150,000 matching grant from funds from a bond issue voters approved in 2014; a grant we ultimately received in early 2016 through the Rhode Island Historical Preservation Commission.

Joe Estrella reported on both maintenance and equipment. The lighthouse exterior was repainted and portions of the foundation repointed using the services of member Andy Leddy's company who gave us an excellent price for the work. He passed around information on the cable that will provide the power to the island and reported on the prep work for the electric installation in the cellar.

The boats were all inspected and properly stored for the season. Joe said he particularly enjoyed his trips out and under the Hurricane Barrier that were offered to those attending the summer BBQ. He is instructing members Alex and Adam Dias on boat handling with the goal of their becoming licensed boaters for the Friends. (continued on page 3)

ELECTRIC POWER PROJECT NEARS KICKOFF

As most of you know, the underwater electric cable running from the foot of Whipple Avenue in Riverside to the Lighthouse was severed by a hurricane in the early 1980's and has never been restored. Our inability to heat the interior of the Lighthouse has always been a problem for us because it has meant that maintaining our restored exterior of the structure has been more expensive than anticipated and, in addition, it makes no sense to begin interior restoration work until we have a heat source that will keep the interior of the premises above freezing on a yearround basis.

For the past year, our pro bono Project Manager, Carlos Neves, of Gilbane Building Company, has been leading the effort to obtain appropriate engineering studies and building permits. The project has not been a simple one - for example our neighbor, ExxonMobil, has graciously allowed us to run the power line off its power grid on the water side of the East Bay Bicycle Path (thereby saving us the cost of installing telephone poles from the foot of Whipple Avenue to the water's edge, and the aggravation of trying to obtain the permits necessary to run cables over or under the bike path), but that in turn has required time-consuming surveying studies and the signing of appropriate real estate easements with ExxonMobil. Carlos has been successful in obtaining a host of permits from state and federal agencies, including, among others, The Army Corps of Engineers, Coastal Resources Management Council, and the Rhode Island Historic Preservation and Heritage Commission, Cooperation has also been received from the Coast Guard, National Grid and the City of East Providence.

Specialty Diving Services, Inc., located in North Kingstown, has been selected as The Trade Contractor to furnish all labor (including underwater divers), material supplies, supervision and equipment for the project at a cost of \$274,885. The single most expensive portion of the contract is the cost of the cable, and we anticipate the contract to buy the cable will be executed within the next week or two. There is a built-in three months' delay between the time the cable is ordered and the time it is delivered to Specialty Diving Services, and thus all interested parties are planning to have the project completed during the summer months.

Special thanks go to Board Members Joe Estrella and Mike Tripp for lending their commonsense advice and expertise as this project has moved forward - their foresight and practical experience has made it easier for us to work with our Project Manager and to make realistic budget projections.

We now have two boats for use to transport our members out to the lighthouse, our 18 foot Red Boat and our Launch, The Lady Pomham. Since our lighthouse is on an island, it is essential that we maintain good transportation to it. Here are the

costs for maintaining these boats: trailer registration-\$9.00, trailer 2 new tires-\$176.00, year storage for Red Boat-\$365.00, Red Boat registration-\$32.00, Launch registration-\$75.00, mooring at Lighthouse-\$200.00, winterizing Red Boat-\$377.00, winterizing the Launch-\$40.00 (we own our covering), storing Launch (winter)-\$550.00, hauling Launch in and out of the water-\$285.00, summer slip for Launch-\$1,360.00, fuel for Launch-\$53.00, fuel for Red Boat per round trip to lighthouse-\$25.00.

Here are a couple of other facts about our boats: Our floating dock can hold a 32 foot boat on the north side and an 18 foot boat on the south side.

Our Launch carries 12 people including the captain, our Red Boat carries 6 people including the captain. The boats are insured by ALF. Our mooring out at the lighthouse will hold a 36 foot boat.

STARS AND LIGHTS BY DAVID ZAPATKA

The Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse are inviting its members and the public to a pleasant evening of viewing stunning photographs of lighthouses at night. The photographs will be displayed in a PowerPoint format.

Mr. David Zapatka, president of the Plum Beach Lighthouse Association, started a project in 2013 to take pictures of the lanterns of many of our local lighthouses at night in ideal conditions. Mr. Zapatka's photographs have been shown at many festivals and exhibits throughout Rhode Island, Massachusetts, Connecticut and New York. David began his career when he was in high school in Westerly. He became a camera man at WJAR and became a freelance photographer. He did work for NBC, ABC, CBS, PBS, HBO and CNN. He has photographed events in 49 states and 30 countries. He has covered 6 Super Bowls, 17 NCAA Basketball tournaments and 4 Olympics.
